Structural or design features: Butler manufactured the Widespan framing system and MR-24 standing seam roof system used in conjunction with tilt-up concrete walls. The facility, which serves as a prototype for possible future franchises, was completed in eight months.

Special interest: This design-build project had to undergo a complete redesign when a different site was selected during the planning process. The new site in a business park required the facility to have the appearance of a multi-tenant office building. That was achieved using faux entrances and spandrel glass that mimic normal windows. The basketball facility contains four high school and two college regulation courts with NBA-quality floors, six skyboxes, seating for 2,000, a fitness center, café, party rooms, and retail areas.
